Business Manager's Report

Brothers and Sisters,

I hope the first quarter of the year has been good to you and your families, and that you are looking forward to an enjoyable summer. As the economy continues to recover, I remain optimistic that the summer months will see an uptick in work hours so that we can continue to put as many members back to work as possible. As we look forward to the future work that will sustain this union. I want to take the time to thank and commend the Trade Board, each of whom worked tirelessly these past few months on our recently ratified contract. As you know, our goal in contract negotiations is to ensure our members are afforded the pay, benefits and working conditions commensurate with the essential and important work that we do. Changes and improvements reflected in the new contract were made with the benefit of the members in mind. We must balance that with the ability to continue to win market share and ensure that our contractors are competitive now and in the future for our industry. I am proud to say that through the work of the Trade Board and elected officers, I believe we have achieved these goals and set 638 up for growth in future years.

I also want to highlight a historic announcement that was made at the recent annual Building Trades Conference this past March: In partnership with the rest of the New York City Building Trades, we will be making an investment with Cirrus, a noted real estate developer, and the City of New York to build over \$400 million dollars of workforce housing in New York City. These new units of housing will be tailored to middle class, working people who have been squeezed out of New York's luxury market, and most importantly the funds will require the use of 100% union labor. Members of 638 will see a triple benefit with this partnership between labor, private capital and City Government: pension funds will see a healthy return on investment, union jobs will be created and we will increase the availability for housing for working people like union construction workers, nurses, teachers, police and firefighters.

Dear Brothers and Sisters of 638

I hope everyone had a joyous and blessed Easter season. As we start to put the winter behind us and look forward to the spring, we welcome warmer weather and our vacation checks.

These past few months have been extremely busy, negotiating a new CBA, while simultaneously trying to get favorable legislation passed regarding NY's 421A affordable housing bill and addressing the housing crisis NY faces. We also attended the BCTC conference in Florida where a historic agreement was announced between the Building Trades and the City of NY to build "Workforce Housing". The BCTC and several Unions, Local 638 being one of the first, agreed to cooperatively invest \$100 million dollars with Cirrus to build housing for middle class working men and women of NY. The unions will invest and build on vacant land advantageously leased from the city. The best part is it will be done 100% Union. For too long the pattern in NY has been to build housing designed for affordable housing which we don't qualify for, or market share housing built by greedy RE investors which we can't afford. Looking at the big picture over the years this pattern has resulted in more members moving out of the five boroughs into the suburbs where we can afford to achieve the American dream of home ownership. All this resulting in less constituents in the city and the politicians know this. It's one of the first things they ask when we meet them. "How many members live in my district?" So hopefully this first "Workforce Housing" agreement will be the first of many and can help address two problems at the same time. This was presented to your Business Manager Robert Bartels and the Executive Board of the BCTC, and I, along with the other Trustees, saw the incredible opportunity here and were eager to be one of the first nine unions to get on board. As has always been now and in the past, Local 638 is an

industry leader of Union construction in New York and we will continue to the lead the way long into the future.

I want to acknowledge and thank your Trade Board, Chairman Kevin Benik, Thomas Davis, and Jayson Gleason job well done Brothers! It was truly a pleasure working together. I also want to thank Business Manager Robert Bartels for his leadership and experience steering us through the process. Knowing when to push and to always stand our ground is a negotiating skill you only learn through experience and we were glad to have his leadership there in the board room. We were able to successfully negotiate a fair deal for Local 638 the main goal being keeping members working. The addition of language securing separate shanties for our Sisters of Local 638 was a big win and something we all felt was a long time coming. The apprentice addendum was another important issue which took a while to resolve. Since I've taken office the weekly reports from the Training Center of apprentice employment has been a concern. This list of unemployed apprentices has been as high as 40 and an average of 28. Even more concerning was the higher rate of 3rd, 4th, and 5th year apprentices on the list. Brothers and Sisters, our apprentices are the future of our local, they need to work and they need to stay working and learn our trade before they reach journeyman wages. Our hope is this addendum will help solve this pressing issue, but just in case, we put in place safeguards that give us control over the new addendum. I want to thank the members who came out to the CBA vote and made their voices heard. Your contribution is greatly appreciated.

We have been putting out information at the meetings about joining your local City Community Boards and asking members who live in the city to join their local boards. We truly appreciate those members who have stepped up and those that have served for

years. It does help with access to the politicians when they see members involved. So if you are at a point in life where you can spare some time and get involved, your contribution would be greatly appreciated.

This year we are excited to announce that Local 638 will be attending and marching as an organization in the National Puerto Rican Day parade which will take place on Sunday June 9th. For information reach out to Parade Chairman Mike Koebel, myself or brother Kevin Gil who was instrumental in getting this launched.

Thankfully our man hours have increased consistently month over month since we took office last July. That in large part is due to all of your Officers of 638

working hard on a daily basis, and working together as a team. I want to thank all of them along with the staff at your Union Hall and the staff of the Fund Office, you make our jobs manageable. We are all pulling in the same direction here, that being for the betterment of our beloved Union and you, Brothers and Sisters of Local 638.

IMPORTANT: SST RENEWAL INFORMATION

Site Safety Training Cards must be renewed every 5 years <u>BEFORE</u> the expiration date. Per NYC Department of Buildings, <u>there is NO GRACE PERIOD</u>. You must complete the refresher courses, apply, and obtain your renewed card BEFORE your old card expires. If you do not have the new card in hand the day your old card expires, you will have to complete all 40 (worker) or 62 (supervisor) hours of training again.

- New Certification Course: Next Generation of Low GWP Refrigerants A2L Mildly Flammable Refrigerants Certification Course. 4 evening prep sessions and one evening test date. A laptop computer or Chromebook is required. Certification Diploma will be issued upon passing grade on examination.
- Introduction to Refrigeration One night a week for 6 weeks: This course is designed to give you a solid foundation on the science and technology behind commercial and residential refrigeration systems.
- EPA Section 608 Prep and Test 3 Prep sessions plus the test date. Technicians who successfully pass the core and 3 types will receive their CFC Universal Certification. A laptop is required to take the exam.
