Business Manager's Report

Brothers and Sisters,

I am honored once again to report back to you on the last quarter of accomplishments from 638. We continue to grow workhours for our members and capture more of the market in our industry.

On the political front, I want to start by thanking the fourth-year apprentice class and instructors for leading the first inperson lobby day in the state capital since the pandemic. Nearly 40 members of Local 638 traveled up to the capital and had meetings with over a dozen lawmakers from New York City and Long Island. Our members joined brothers and sisters from other Pipetrades locals across the state to advocate for prevailing wage on public construction jobs, greater enforcement of sprinkler and fire safety law, public funding for thermal energy networks, and closing the loopholes that allow for contractors to skirt union labor with offsite fabrication and modular construction. We owe our thanks and appreciation to the fourth-year apprentices and their instructors who took a day to make this happen.

The officers of this Union are always advocating for 638 with our local politicians, but nothing is more effective than having our members be directly present and involved in the political process. The state budget and legislative session are ongoing until July of this year, but I am optimistic we will see some victories that strengthen and expand prevailing wage with more funding for thermal energy networks that will bolster the market for our work.

We have been active and involved at the local level in New York City, showing up and supporting large scale projects that will employ union labor. In March, we advocated for the \$2 billion expansion of Lennox Hill, which will be built under a PLA with all union labor. We also weighed in testimony with public community meetings to support the redevelopment of the Brooklyn Marine Terminal in Red Hook, which will also be built under a Building Trades PLA. From the local, to the state and the national level, we will continue to advocate for union jobs.

From the Desk of the Financial Secretary-Treasurer

Dear Brothers & Sisters;

We are now exactly a year away from the next Local 638 General Election of Officers & the Election of Delegates for the UA National Convention. To vote you must be a member in good standing for 1 (ONE) year prior, but to be nominated for a position in either election you must be a member in good standing for 2 (TWO) years prior. Good standing means you have not paid any Reinstatement Fees in the year or years prior to be eligible.

Please have your dues paid before midnight on the last day of each month, there is <u>No More</u> grace period; on the first day after 3 months of nonpayment of dues you will be charged a \$50.00 reinstatement fee to get back in good standing.

As a reminder NO CASH will be accepted in the Union Office. Ways to pay your union dues:

- Come into the Dues Office with a check or money order.
- Mail a check or money order into the Dues Office.
- Set up a reoccurring payment through <u>YOUR BANK ACCOUNT</u> where they send the Union a check monthly using your book # as your account #.
- Go to <u>www.steamfitters638.org</u> and pay your dues online.
 User Name = Last Name + Password = Book #.

If you do owe a Reinstatement Fee, you can NOW pay that fee plus and all back dues online using a debit or credit card.

Metal Trades Branch Contract Ratification Vote

The vote to ratify the contract for the Metal Trades Branch will take place on Sunday, June 8, 2025, from 8:00AM to Noon at our 638 Meeting Hall at 32-32 48th Avenue, Long Island City, NY 11101. Please make sure you have your UA Card; your Local 638 ID Card and your dues are current through March of 2025. You also must be in good standing since June of 2024.

<u>UA Constitution, Section 124 (a)</u>: No member shall nominate candidates for or vote in any election of any description unless he has been a member in good standing in the Local Union where the vote is being taken for a period of one (1) year immediately prior to the date of election. Any member who owes or has paid a reinstatement fee within a period of one (1) year immediately prior to the date of election shall not be eligible to nominate candidates for or vote in any Local Union election.



Dear Brothers and Sisters of 638,

I hope this letter finds everyone in good health as we leave winter behind us and welcome spring. This is always a great time of year for us Steamfitters and the construction industry as a whole. As I write this letter we are concluding the annual winter NYC BCTC and NSBT conference in Florida.

This conference takes a look at the successes and the areas we need to improve on from the last year, while also looking forward through 2025 and beyond to lay out objectives and goals to sustain our industry. Unfortunately, the past few years of higher interest rates has had a direct and correlating negative impact on the amount of building permits being issued in NYC. What has sustained us were large infrastructure projects and Local 638's ability to compete in the residential market utilizing the various tools we have at our disposal. In 2023 during the absence of tax abatements, NY lagged behind the broader US. However following the implementation of NY law 485x, NY has been outperforming the rest of the country when it comes to the residential housing market. A very important agenda of the BCTC which is moving forward is the development of workforce housing. For far too long we have been building low income residential housing in and around NYC at the request of our elected officials, or market rate housing to satisfy greedy developers. During these decades we the middle class, tax paying workforce have been pushed to live farther away. The answer to this situation is finally beginning to be addressed, we should have the first two Cirrus fund projects start the permit and design stage by the end of the year. The Fordham landing project in the Bronx and the Flushing airport project in Queens . This is fantastic news for our industry and has the ability to transform the residential market. Workforce housing currently consists of just 4% of the overall market nationwide. The Cirrus model which is Union funded, union built and union maintained on unused land leased from the city, all to house middle income families. We expect this model to become a benchmark to prove once and for all we can build housing designed for the people who actually build this city and serve it.

Another transition for our industry is the energy market. Recently renewable energy projects such as solar and wind have been cancelled by the Trump administration. While I would rather see the projects that were already being built continue to completion, the irrational push by our NYS legislators to transition to a carbon free energy grid is not good for our economy or for the rate payers. You only need to look as far as Germany to

see the negative impact these policies have on both. They started their Green energy agenda 30 yrs ago, as a result they are reliant on neighboring countries to import their energy supply. Without tax credits green energy policies are not affordable, they are not reliable, consistent or storable. These are major obstacles beside the fact that one 600 megawatt gas cogeneration plant can be built on 80 acres as opposed to 5000 acres for solar, or miles of wind turbines in our oceans to meet the same demand. The other major obstacle is the distribution network needed to transport the electricity from these greater distances. All of these issues equate to higher costs and less reliability to some of the densest populations centers in our country.

Other more reasonable answers to a green energy transition are thermal energy networks. These networks would take waste heat from computer data centers, or raw sewage and transport that energy to buildings or spaces that need it. Campuses or complexes such as Rockefeller center or a complex in Chelsea will be the first to implement these new technologies. This is great news for Local 638, we are perfectly situated and trained for these emerging fields.

On the subject of Training, we have completed the 2024-25 apprentice recruitment. I would like to thank the staff at the Training Center led by Director Danny Knights for a successful campaign. I would also like to thank the other officers and representatives from the MCA who helped during the interview process. Job well done! The NYS Dept. of Labor list is finalized, and the applicants have their rankings, congratulations to all. The first class of apprentices will be inducted sometime this summer along with some of the helpers from our direct-entry programs, we look forward to welcoming the next generation of Local 638 apprentices. I would like to take this opportunity to speak to our Journeyman while on the subject of apprentices. We need your help getting these apprentices to work and trained for their future and ours. They are the health and vitality of our Union and as I get closer to the end of my career, I look for them to carry the torch so I will be able to retire with dignity and economic security like my own father a 57 year member. To the many retirees whom I worked with over the course of my career, who selflessly trained me or took the time from their lunch to help me learn to weld thank you. If you're a journeyman reading this please pass your knowledge and expertise on, for me there was nothing more rewarding. To the apprentices and young journeyman learn your craft and please learn how to weld, Local 638 does not have enough certified welders. When as a foreman starting up a job, I always hired welders to be first on and last off a job, this was a necessity.

IMPORTANT: SST RENEWAL INFORMATION

Site Safety Training Cards must be renewed every 5 years <u>BEFORE</u> the expiration date. Per NYC Department of Buildings, <u>there is NO GRACE PERIOD</u>. You must complete the refresher courses, apply, and obtain your renewed card BEFORE your old card expires. If you do not have the new card in hand the day your old card expires, you will have to complete all 40 (worker) or 62 (supervisor) hours of training again.

DOB WORKER WALLET CARDS

Beginning November 1st, 2024, any member who completed an In Person 4 Hour Scaffold Course or 16 Hour Rigging Course will be issued a TRAINING CONNECT WORKER WALLET card. This is a new requirement from the Department of Buildings. This is a SEPARATE CARD from the SST.

Any member who CURRENTLY has a 4 Hour Scaffold card or a 16 Hour Rigging card that is less than 4 years old will be issued a Worker Wallet card to replace their existing card. The new cards will be automatically printed and mailed out to the members before the July 1st, 2025 deadline. You DO NOT need to request a new card.

- Next Generation of Low GWP Refrigerants A2L Mildly Flammable Refrigerants Certification Course. 4 evening prep sessions and one evening test date. A laptop computer or Chromebook is required. Attendees must have EPA 608 universal as a pre-requisite. Certification Diploma will be issued upon passing grade on examination.
- Introduction to Refrigeration One night a week for 6 weeks: This course is designed to give you a solid foundation on the science and technology behind commercial and residential refrigeration systems.
- EPA Section 608 Prep and Test One night a week for 4 to 5 weeks. Technicians who successfully pass the core and 3 types will receive their CFC Universal Certification. A laptop is required to take the exam.
- UA Star Mastery Examination: Metal Trades Technicians wishing to take the prep courses and exam must have a minimum of five years of documented work experience installing and servicing HVACR equipment and piping systems. This Certification requires an application, and it has a fee payable to the testing agency.
